DVT and their Responsibilities

Deadwater Valley Trust (DVT) is responsible for managing the Deadwater Valley Local Nature Reserve and Bordon Inclosure in Whitehill & Bordon.



DVT recognises it has a general duty of care to volunteers and is fully insured to cover public work. All rangers are first aid qualified.

Rangers always make risk assessments for each particular task and will advise volunteers accordingly.

All tools, equipment and protective gloves are supplied by DVT. We even supply hot drinks and biscuits. All you need to bring is enthusiasm, a love of nature and some spare time.

Normally, practical volunteering days are in the Local Nature Reserve on Mondays from 11.00am (Meet at Conde Way Car Park), or in Bordon Inclosure on the first Saturday of the month from 10am to midday (meet at St Lucia Car Park behind the building works).



If you don't want to do practical conservation work you can also help at one of our many events, help with fundraising, help with office work or assist with wildlife surveys.
